- A. Purpose. The enclosed Cyber Training Verification Job Aid (09 January 2026) equips Coast Guard Vessel and Facility inspectors with key questions and answers to verify cybersecurity training requirements detailed in references (a & b). It provides a foundational framework for addressing common cybersecurity concerns and includes targeted queries for effective inspection procedures. It is expected that these questions will be incorporated into the existing inspection regiment. This guide provides a starting point and is not intended to limit inspector and COTP/OCMI discretion. Inspectors should consult the unit Marine Transportation System Specialist-Cybersecurity (or District if unit not available) for expertise as needed.
